HISTORY OF SKI ASSOCIATIONS IN CALIFORNIA

On February 21, 1904 a small group of Nordic skiers met in a local banker's office in Ishpeming, Michigan and founded the National Ski Association of America (NSA). On December 14, 1930 the California Ski Association was bought into this national organization.

Skiing at that time in the Sierras was the domain of the very local people. Read: those trapped in the mountains as opposed to those who came for the weekend. The roads thru the Sierras during the winter were all closed at the snow line. There were times the roads would not be reopened until mid June or July based on how heavy the snow fall had been that season.

Early in the 1928-1929 ski season a group of young Auburn would-be skiers, armed with mail order skis, began heading to the snow. The most prominent, if not first of the modern ski clubs was the Auburn Ski Club. With shovels and borrowed machinery they kept US Highway


40 was free to the public and over 2,400 cars traveled to the dead end at Cisco causing a monumental traffic jam. Auburn Ski Club members had transported the California Legislature to the event, complete with a "mountain dew spring." Remember that this was during prohibition. The local chapter of the E Clampus Vitus "found" an uncharted "mountain dew spring", which has since gone dry. This event prompted the state to keep US Highway 40 open on a year round basis.

After World War II, the National Ski Association emerged as the United States Ski Association (USSA) and the California Ski Association (CSA) became its Far West Division, later called Far West Ski Association (FWSA). FWSA has since grown to encompass additional Ski Councils in Arizona, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon and Washington.

In late 1940, the Bay Area Ski Federation was organized for the welfare of Bay Area skiers and appointed Carson White as the first chairman. Finally, in 1961 after eight years of courtship, the Federation, now under Miss Hardie's administration, voted to join the FWSA as the Bay Area Council.

The Council name and mission evolved to Bay Area Council of Ski Clubs and grew to include 35 paid member clubs in the next two decades. To embrace all snow sports activities, the current name is now Bay Area Snow Sports Council, a member council in Far West Ski Association and a charter member of the National Ski Council Federation.
