The BAC will conduct its annual **SKI FOR ALL** on March 27, 2010, at **SQUAW VALLEY**. Funds generated will be donated to Disabled Sports USA Far West (DSUSAFW) to support their adaptive snowsports instruction program. You do not have to be a NorCal racer to participate in the **SKI FOR ALL**.

Participants with \$100 in paid donations will receive a full day lift ticket and a \$5 lunch voucher. Donation gatherers who turn in paid donations totaling \$100 to \$200 will also be entered in a drawing for special prizes. For each \$200 in paid donations, an entry in your name will be included in the drawing for the grand prize:

A pair of **ATOMIC** skis and bindings or snowboard and bindings of your choice

Of course, all participants will be winners ... having helped people with disabilities develop a "can do" attitude and positive self-image.

How It Works

If you cannot attend the Ski For All on March 27th at Squaw Valley, you can still help us offer opportunities to people with disabilities. Here's how:

Raise \$100 or more in Ski For All pledges and receive a complimentary all-day Alpine Meadows lift ticket for a day of your choice between March 28th and April 11th.

You must call Disabled Sports Program Center (530) 581-4161 at least four days in advance of the day you want to ski and bring your pledges and paperwork with you on the day you ski to receive your lift ticket.
